



# DOUGLAS COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE 2020 STATISTICS SUMMARY

Statistics change frequently due to continuous data entry, case reclassifications, and updates. For this reason, monthly statistics will not total quarterly statistics, semi-annual statistics, or year-end statistics.

## **Crime Summary**

The statistics summarized in this report do not include crimes that occurred in the municipal jurisdictions of Aurora, Castle Rock, Littleton, Lone Tree, or Parker. All percentages are rounded.

## **Population**

According to the Douglas County Community Development Department, the January, 2021 total Douglas County population was 379,000. In January of 2020, the total county population was 370,000, reflecting a population increase of 2% during 2020. The January, 2021 Douglas County Sheriff's Office jurisdiction population (unincorporated areas, Castle Pines and Larkspur) was estimated to be 222,451. The January, 2020 Douglas County Sheriff's Office jurisdiction population was 217,770, a population increase of 2% during 2020.<sup>1</sup>

## **2020 Notable Findings**

- Total crime increased 2% between 2019 and 2020.
- The Douglas County School District's implementation of remote learning due to the COVID-19 pandemic likely prevented a larger increase in total crime in 2020. School crime is estimated to account for approximately 5-8% of total crime in Douglas County, and without several months of remote learning in 2020, the total crime increase may have been several percentage points higher. More on COVID-19 impacts below.
- According to Uniform Crime Summary (UCR) crime categories, there was virtually no change in violent crime (murder and non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault), and property crime (burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft and arson) increased 13%. (Note: UCR data is summary-based and only counts the highest charge of a criminal event. Sheriff's Office data is incident-based and counts all crimes in an event.)
- According to UCR figures from the FBI, selected law enforcement agencies across the Nation reported a decrease in both violent crime and property crime between the first half of 2019 and the first half of 2020. Violent crime decreased 1% in the West, and property crime decreased 5% in the West.<sup>2</sup> Complete 2020 UCR data is not yet available.
- Total crime in the State of Colorado increased 3% between 2019 and 2020.<sup>3</sup>
- **The COVID-19 pandemic uniquely impacted crime, calls for service, and traffic-related issues in Douglas County in 2020. Most notably:**
  - **Citizen-initiated calls for service decreased 8% due to stay-at-home orders.**
  - **Property crimes increased 13% due to several factors such as lost jobs, jails not accepting or holding non-violent offenders, etc.**
  - **School crime decreased 27% between January through December of 2020 due to remote learning, preventing higher total crime increases.**
  - **Domestic violence increased 29% and non-criminal family disturbances increased 31%, likely due to increased family togetherness.**
  - **Suicides decreased 35% and mental health holds decreased 17%, possibly also due to increased family togetherness.**
  - **DUIs increased 8% despite fewer cars on the road.**
  - **Crashes decreased 33% due to fewer cars on the road.**
  - **Traffic violations decreased 50% due to fewer cars on the road and reduced enforcement.**
- Excluding the "All Other Offenses" crime category, which counts numerous miscellaneous offenses together, the five most commonly occurring crimes were:

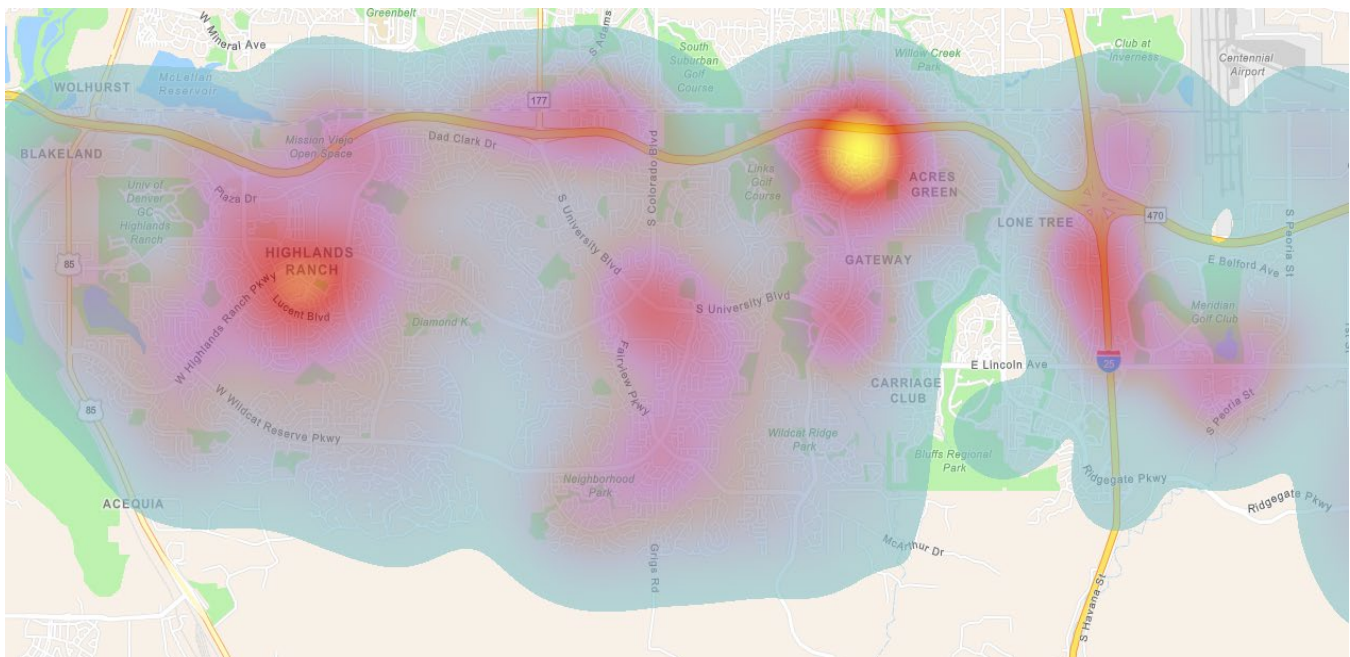

- The most significant crime increases between 2019 and 2020, not taking into account small numbers that are responsible for large percentage increases, were a 148% increase in arson (21 in 2019 and 52 in 2020), a 107% increase in stolen property offenses, and a 92% increase in motor vehicle theft.
- In 2020, 159 stolen vehicles from outside agencies were recovered, compared to 93 in 2019.
- According to the Metropolitan Auto Theft Task Force Annual Report, auto thefts in the Denver Metro area increased 55% between 2019 and 2020. Countywide (including municipalities), Douglas County saw a 77% increase in auto theft, the second highest increase when compared to other Denver Metro counties.<sup>4</sup>
- There were four reported murders in 2020 compared to two in 2019. Two additional murders occurred in 2020; however, murder charges were not filed during the year due to ongoing investigations. The additional charges are anticipated in 2021.
- According to a report from the National Commission of COVID-19 and Criminal Justice (NCCCJ), homicides increased 30% between 2019 and 2020 in a sample of 34 major U.S. cities. Denver, Colorado was one of the sampled cities, and Denver reported a 25% increase in homicides in 2020. In addition to the historic increases in homicides, gun assaults and aggravated assaults in the studied cities increased 8% and 6%, respectively.<sup>5</sup> In Douglas County, weapons offenses increased 16% and aggravated assaults increased 8% during the year.
- There were 18 robberies in 2020 compared to 22 in 2019.
- December had the most crime (despite stay-at-home orders) in 2020 followed by August.
- February had the least amount of crime (prior to COVID-19) followed by March.
- Not including schools, the most significant crime hot spots were Business Center Dr, the Highlands Ranch Town Center area, apartments north of Lincoln Station along Park Meadows Dr, the Lincoln Pointe Lofts in Meridian, the Quality Inn & Suites in Meridian, Autumn Chase Apartments in Highlands Ranch, and University Blvd between Highlands Ranch Pkwy (Colorado Blvd) & Wildcat Reserve Pkwy.



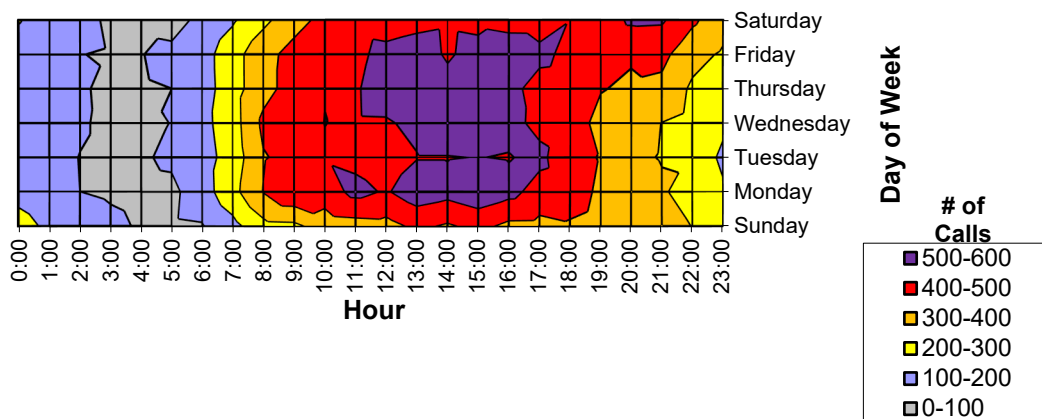
- Not including schools, the top crime locations were:
  1. 6675 Business Center Dr (128 offenses)
  2. 8565 Poplar Way (93 offenses)
  3. 8673 S Quebec St (86 offenses)
- The top three crime locations at schools were:
  1. Highlands Ranch High School, 9375 Cresthill Ln (49 offenses—down from 219 offenses in 2019)
  2. Ponderosa High School, 7007 Bayou Gulch Rd (45 offenses)
  3. ThunderRidge High School, 1991 W Wildcat Reserve Pkwy (34 offenses)

- Total crime and non-criminal incidents at secondary schools decreased 11% between the 2018/2019 school year and the 2019/2020 school year, and school crime and non-criminal incidents decreased 29% between August and December of 2020 compared to August through December of 2019.
- Districts 3 had the highest percentage of crime followed by District 2.
- Crime in Castle Pines increased 55%, crime in Highlands Ranch increased 4%, and there was an 18% decrease in crime in Larkspur.
- There was a 7% increase in total deaths between 2019 and 2020.
- Of the total deaths, 59% were natural deaths and 15% were suicides.
- There was a 35% decrease in suicides.
- There was an 8% decrease in the number of citizen-initiated calls for service between 2019 and 2020.
- District 3 had the highest percentage of calls for service followed by District 4.
- Friday was the day of the week with the most calls for service, which has remained the top day of week since 2007.
- The time frame between 1300-1359 hours had the most calls for service, followed by 1500-1559 hours and 1600-1659 hours.
- The peak call for service day and time was Friday between 1600-1659 hours, followed by Monday between 1500-1559 hours.

### 2020 Calls for Service by Day and Hour



- The top three citizen-initiated calls for service (excluding those dispositioned to another agency) were welfare checks, citizen assists, and suspicious circumstance calls.
- The top priority-1 citizen-initiated calls for service were domestics and disturbances.
- The top three citizen-initiated call for service locations were:
  1. 8565 S Poplar Way (179 calls; also top crime location)
  2. 6675 Business Center Dr (165 calls; also top crime location)
  3. 8835 American Way (152 calls)
- There was an 11% decrease in the average priority-1 response time between 2019 and 2020, and there was a 17% decrease in the priority-2 response time. In early 2020, call types and call type responses were revised to better prioritize calls for service.
- Total arrests decreased 9% between 2019 and 2020.
- Of the total arrests, 81% were adults and 19% were juveniles. In 2019, juvenile arrests accounted for 27% of the total arrests.
- Excluding the “All Other Offenses” crime category, which counts numerous miscellaneous offenses together, adults were arrested most often for DUI followed by drug offenses, and juveniles were arrested most often for drug offenses followed by curfew violations.
- Excluding the “All Other Offenses” crime category, adults and juveniles combined were arrested most often for drug offenses.
- Drug arrests accounted for 12% of the total arrests.

- Of the arrests where data was collected regarding alcohol use, 42% of the arrestees were believed to be under the influence of alcohol at the time of their arrest.
- Of the arrests where data was collected regarding drug use, 24% of the arrestees were believed to be under the influence of drugs at the time of their arrest.
- Of the total arrests where resident status was collected, 49% of the arrestees were residents of Douglas County and 51% were non-residents. In 2019, 61% were residents and 39% were non-residents.

### **2015 – 2020 Notable Findings**

- There was a 20% increase in total crime between 2015 and 2020. During this same timeframe, the Douglas County Sheriff's Office jurisdiction population increased 10%.
- Between 2015 and 2020, crime in Colorado increased 12%, and the state population increased 5%.<sup>3</sup>
- The most significant crime increases between 2015 and 2020, not taking into account small numbers that were responsible for large percentage increases, were a 754% increase in stolen property offenses (26 in 2015 and 222 in 2020), a 148% increase in motor vehicle theft, a 127% increase in weapon law violations, a 97% increase in drug/narcotics violations, and an 87% increase in trespass auto.
- The 2020 offenses with the most significant increases when compared to the 2015 to 2019 averages were trespass auto, motor vehicle theft, and stolen property offenses.

### **2020 Traffic**

- There was a 33% decrease in crashes between 2019 and 2020.
- Non-injury crashes decreased 36% and injury crashes increased 20%.
- Of the total crashes, 91% were non-injury.
- There were eight fatal crashes in 2020 compared to five in 2019.
- Of the eight fatal crashes, four involved motorcycles in rural areas across the county.

- District 3 had the highest percentage of crashes followed by District 2.
- Crashes decreased in all districts.
- The most significant crash hot spots were the areas of University Blvd between Highlands Ranch Pkwy (Colorado Blvd) & Cresthill Ln, Highlands Ranch Pkwy between Broadway & Lucent Blvd, and Quebec St between Business Center Dr & County Line Rd. See hot spot map on the following page.

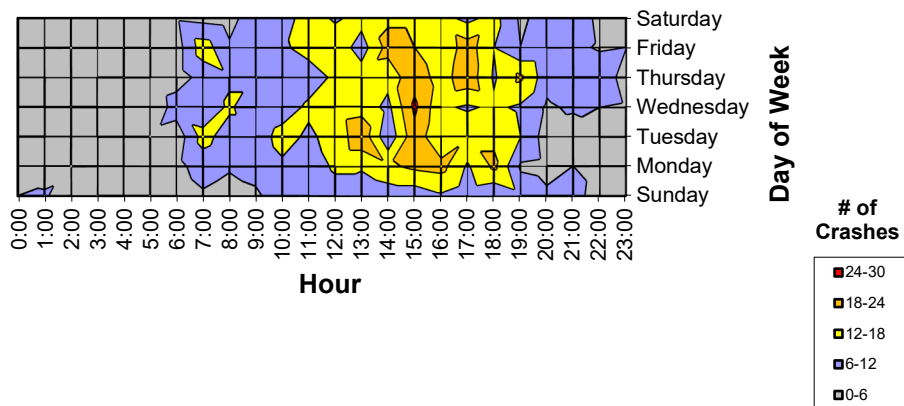

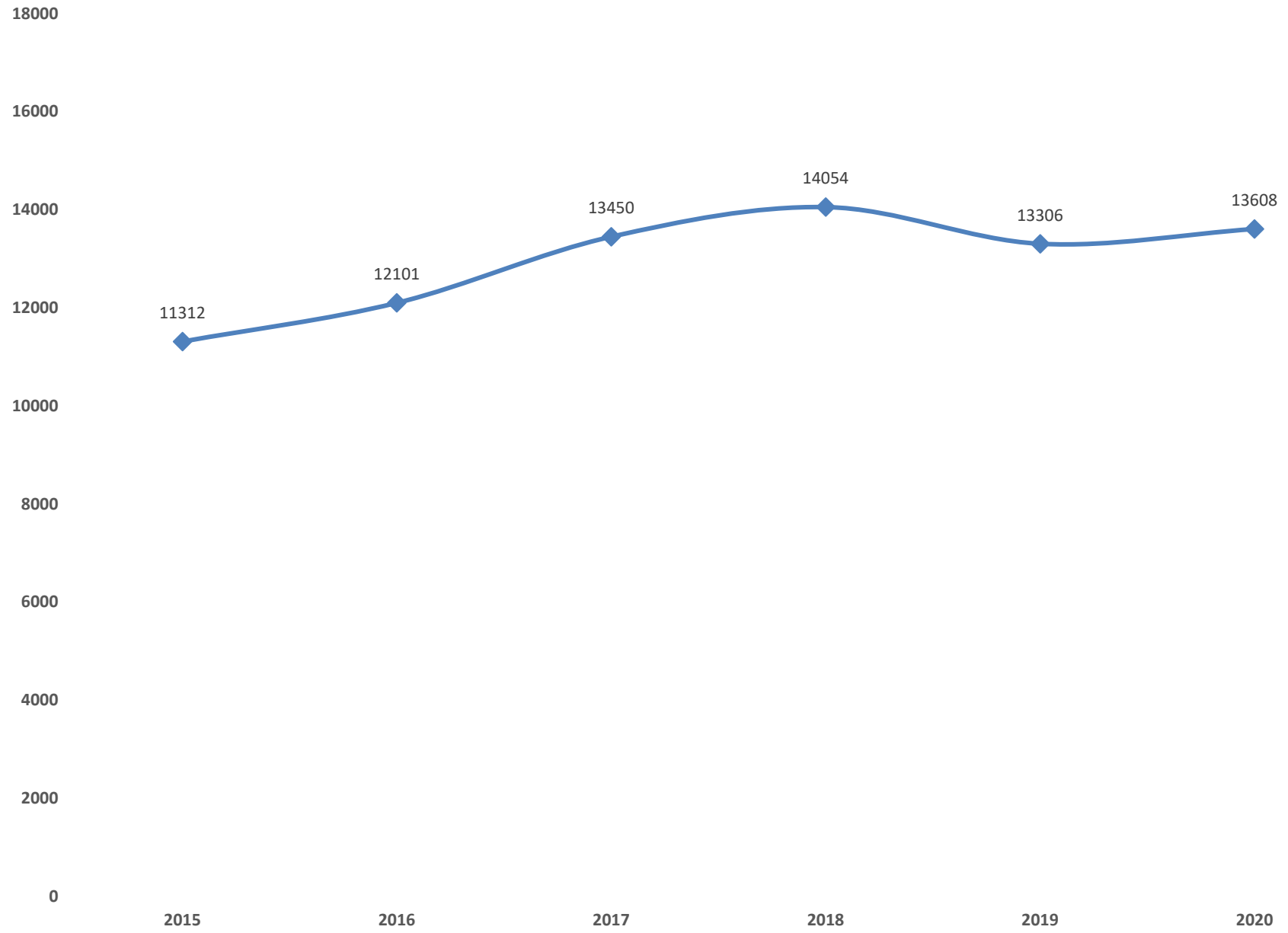
